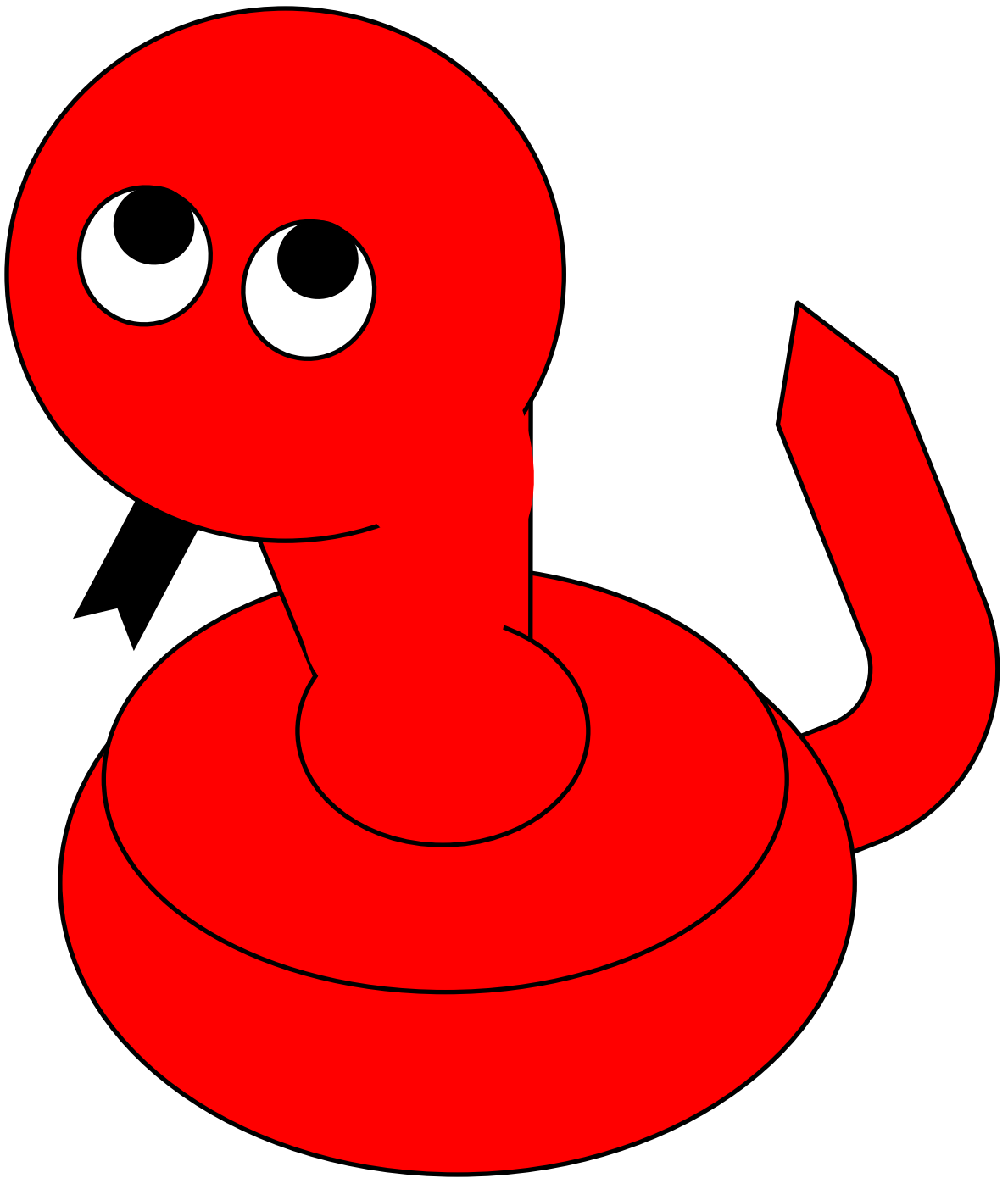












Instructions: The Little White Duck

Put 4 sticky Velcro on holding page (rough side)

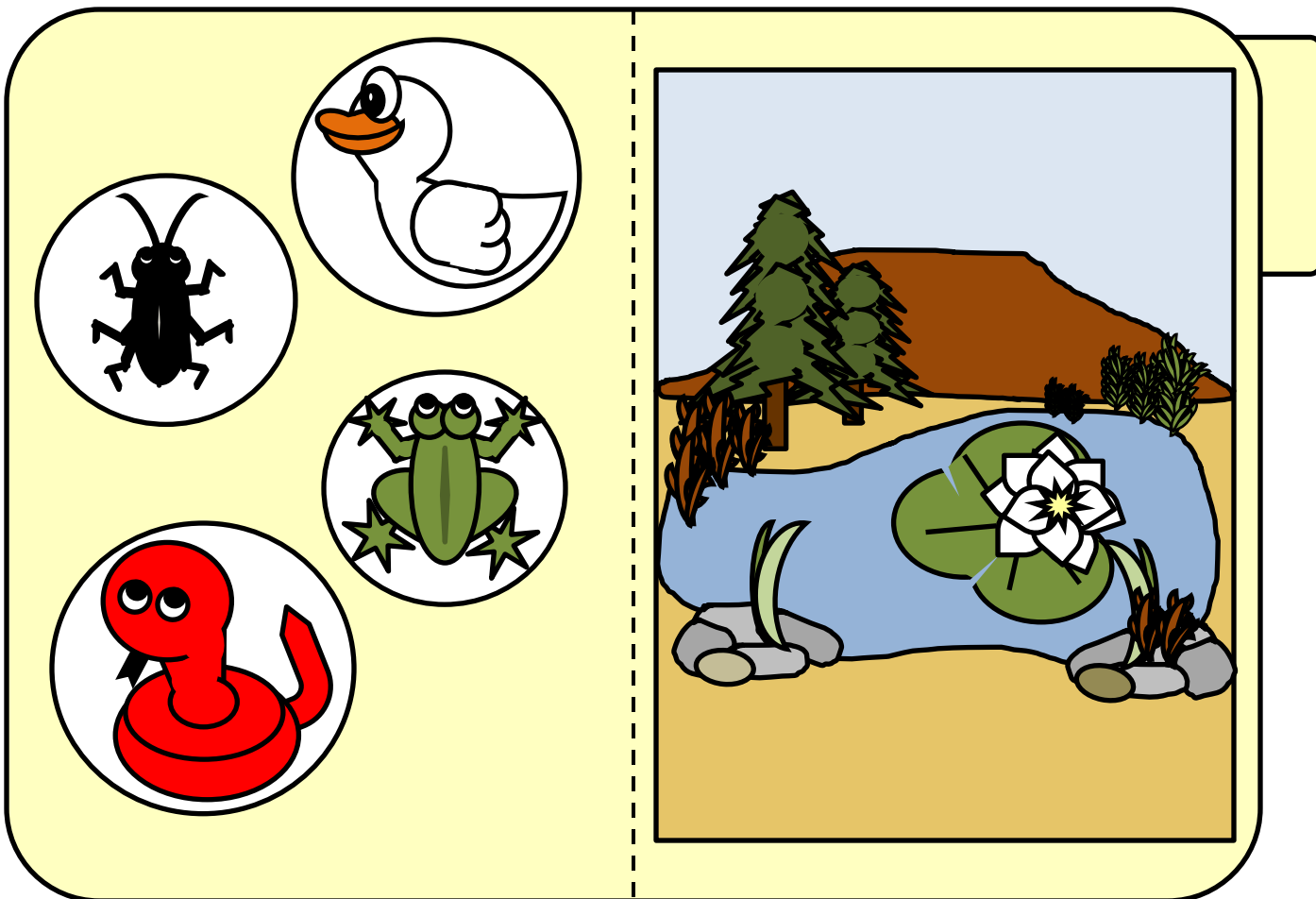

Quack, Quack, Quack"

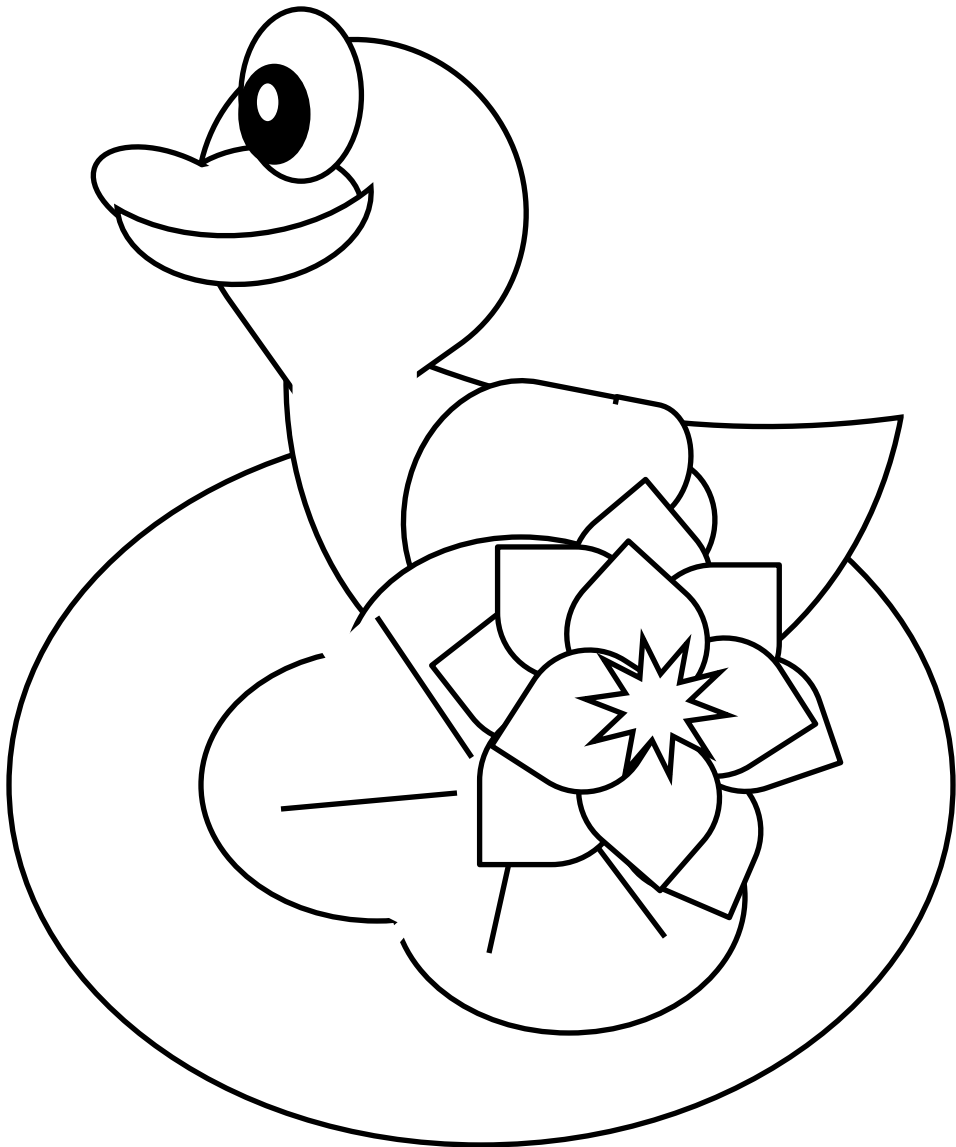
There's a little green frog, swimmin' in the water
