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Statements for target activity. Copy and cut into strips. Have children pick a statement.  
Read statements

You have taken money from your mom's purse.

You have taken and hid your brother's favorite toy.

Your mother asks you if you have cleaned your room, and you really haven't but say "yes" anyway.

You have hit your brother, and your dad asks why he is crying and you say, "He fell down by himself."

You have taken a toy from your friend at school.  
The teacher asks anyone if they have seen that toy, and you say nothing.

Your friend asks you to play at her house.  
When it is time to go home you take a ring from her room.

You have taken something from the store.

You have taken a piece of candy away from your sister's room that belonged to her.

At bedtime, you have not brushed your teeth and lied about it when your mom asks you if you brushed them.

How to do lesson activity on Forgiveness.

Copy target and clouds on cardstock. Copy statements on regular paper.

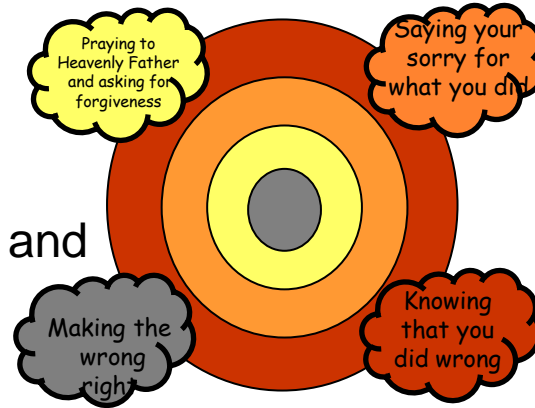
Cut and laminate target and clouds. Put magnetic strip on back.

In class. Place target on board Example:

Have a child pick a statement. Read it.

Have them start with the outer ring and discuss the red, then the orange, yellow, and then the gray or inside of target.

The goal is to get to the middle.



At home use markers, or buttons and move them toward middle when discussing situations.

Questions might include:

What commandment was broken?

Why is wrong?

Do you know what you did was wrong?

Who would you say sorry to?

How would you pray and how often?

How would you make the wrong right? (by never doing it again...) etc.

Use the colored page for the lesson, and use the black and white page and have the children color it to take home. Have them make their own statements and share with family.
