D&C 110: 12

Elias is the Greek form of the Hebrew name *Elijah*, but Elijah appears separately in this revelation and is referred to by his Hebrew name (see v. 13).

Elias is also a title for a forerunner, and several individuals have been identified in this way, including Gabriel or Noah and John the Baptist.

We do not know whether the *Elias* in verse 12 is one of these, or another forerunner, or whether he was an ancient prophet whose personal name was *Elias*.
