Page 18: King Benjamin colored set of 8 and clouds.




\*Make sure the children paste the largest strip first, right at the bottom of the page in the middle.

Paste on King Benjamin after all the word strips are on, then the clouds.





(Mosiah 2:1-2)




The people came up to the temple and they pitched their tents there with their own families. And the door to their tents faced the temple so they could hear King Benjamin.

Because there were so many people he had a tower built so that they could hear him better. He also wanted his words to be written down for those who could not hear him. (Mosiah 2:7-8)




King Benjamin told the people to keep the commandments and they would prosper in the land and bless them because He loves them. (Mosiah 2:4,22)








King Mosiah asked the people to remember who had created them, and that they belong to Him, Heavenly Father. (Mosiah 2:25)


King Benjamin asked them to believe in God. He created all things, both in Heaven and in earth. He has all wisdom and power. (Mosiah 2:9)








The people fell down and began to repent of their sins. They had a change in their hearts, and did ask for forgiveness and made a promise to keep the commandments.




Set of 8 King Benjamin's Copy, cut, and place on top of tower




