




The Book of Mormon was written to help gather Israel and convince all people that Jesus is the Christ.

Gathering Israel

The Book of Mormon refers often to the covenant that the Lord has made to gather Israel.



[In] the Book of Mormon, you will learn the doctrine of the gathering, truths about Jesus Christ, His Atonement, and the fulness of His gospel not found in the Bible. The Book of Mormon is central to the gathering of Israel. In fact, if there were no Book of Mormon, the promised gathering of Israel would not occur. (4)





A title and is the Greek equivalent of the word *Messiah*, which means "the anointed."


In the premortal existence, Jesus was anointed or chosen by Heavenly Father to be our Savior. (2)



The Keystone


When an arch is constructed, the two sides are built up with external supports to hold them upright.


The space at the top of the arch is carefully measured, and the keystone is cut to fit it exactly.




When the keystone is put in place, the arch can stand without supports.

The Three Witnesses never denied their testimony of the Book of Mormon.


They could not because they knew it was true.

That they continued to affirm what they saw and heard in that marvelous experience, during long periods of estrangement from the Church and from Joseph, makes their testimony more powerful. (6)












House of Israel refers to descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. In addition, the house of Israel includes those who are not actual descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob but have accepted the message of the restored gospel and come into the restored Church through the necessary covenants and ordinances.

Jews originally referred to anyone from the tribe of Judah (one of the twelve tribes of Israel). Writers in the Book of Mormon, however, often used this term to refer to all those who lived in the Southern Kingdom of Judah in Old Testament times (2 Nephi 30:4; 33:8), even though they may have been descendants of other tribes of Israel (Alma 10:3). It also refers to "people who practice the religion, lifestyles, and traditions of Judaism but may or may not be Jewish by birth" (Guide to the Scriptures, "Jews," scriptures. ChurchofJesusChrist.org).

Gentiles means "the nations" (Bible Dictionary, "Gentile"). "Sometimes it designates people of non-Israelite lineage, sometimes people of non-Jewish lineage, and sometimes nations that are without the gospel, even though there may be some Israelite blood among the people. This latter usage is especially characteristic of the word as used in the Book of Mormon and Doctrine and Covenants" (Guide to the Scriptures, "Gentiles," scriptures.ChurchofJesusChrist.org).

An abridgment is a shortened version of something.

A **remnant** is a remaining part.

Daily Study:

I promise that as you prayerfully study the Book of Mormon *every day*, you will make better decisions—*every day*. I promise that as you ponder what you study, the windows of heaven will open, and you will receive answers to your own questions and direction for your own life. I promise that as you daily immerse yourself in the Book of Mormon, you can be immunized against the evils of the day, even the gripping plague of pornography and other mind-numbing addictions.

Whenever I hear anyone, including myself, say, "I know the Book of Mormon is true," I want to exclaim, "That's nice, but it is not enough!" We need to feel, deep in "the inmost part" of our hearts [Alma 13:27], that the Book of Mormon *is* unequivocally the word of God. We must feel it so deeply that we would never want to live even one day without it. (Russell M. Nelson, "The Book of Mormon: What Would Your Life Be Like without It?," *Ensign* or *Liahona*, Nov. 2017, 62–63)

Blessings of Studying the Book of Mormon:

It is not just that the Book of Mormon teaches us truth, though it indeed does that. It is not just that the Book of Mormon bears testimony of Christ, though it indeed does that, too. But there is something more. There is a power in the book which will begin to flow into your lives the moment you begin a serious study of the book. You will find greater power to resist temptation. You will find the power to avoid deception. You will find the power to stay on the strait and narrow path. The scriptures are called "the words of life" [Doctrine and Covenants 84:85], and nowhere is that more true than it is of the Book of Mormon. When you begin to hunger and thirst after those words, you will find life in greater and greater abundance. (Ezra Taft Benson, "The Book of Mormon—Keystone of Our Religion," *Ensign*, Nov. 1986, 7)

A Challenge:

In order to help the Book of Mormon become the keystone of your testimony, I offer you a challenge. I recently learned that many young people spend an average of seven hours a day looking at TV, computer, and smartphone screens. With this in mind, would you make a small change? Will you replace some of that daily screen time—particularly that devoted to social media, the internet, gaming, or television—with reading the Book of Mormon? If the studies I referred to are accurate, you could easily find time for daily study of the Book of Mormon even if for only 10 minutes a day. And you can study in a way that allows you to enjoy it and understand it—either on your device or in book form. (Gary E. Historical Events:After Joseph Smith had completed translating the Book of Mormon, he still had to find a


publisher. This was not easy. The complexity of this lengthy manuscript and the cost of printing and binding thousands of copies were intimidating. Joseph first approached E. B. Grandin, a Palmyra printer, who refused. He then sought another printer in Palmyra, who also turned him down. He traveled to Rochester, 25 miles (40 km) away, and approached the most prominent publisher in western New York, who also turned him down. Another Rochester publisher was willing, but circumstances made this alternative unacceptable.

Weeks had passed, and Joseph must have been bewildered at the opposition to accomplishing his divine mandate. The Lord did not make it easy, but He did make it possible. Joseph's fifth attempt, a second approach to the Palmyra publisher Grandin, was successful. (Dallin H. Oaks, "Opposition in All Things," *Ensign* or *Liahona*, May 2016, 116)

Translation:

The translation process of the Book of Mormon was also a miracle. This sacred ancient record was not "translated" in the traditional way that scholars would translate ancient texts by learning an ancient language. We ought to look at the process more like a "revelation" with the aid of physical instruments provided by the Lord, as opposed to a "translation" by one with knowledge of languages. Joseph Smith declared that through God's power he "translated the Book of Mormon from [hieroglyphs], the knowledge of which was lost to the world, in which wonderful event [he] stood alone, an unlearned youth, to combat the worldly wisdom and multiplied ignorance of eighteen centuries, with a new revelation." The Lord's help in the translation of the plates—or revelation, so to speak—is also evident when considering the miraculously short time Joseph Smith took to translate them. (Ulisses Soares, "The Coming Forth of the Book of Mormon," Ensign or Liahona, May 2020, 33)






Why Do We Read the Scriptures?


Rather, it means that in the Book of Mormon we will find the fulness of those doctrines required for our salvation.

And they are taught plainly and simply so that even children can learn the ways of salvation and exaltation."





Printing of the book, An Introduction:

The Book of Mormon was first printed and sold in the Grandin Building located in downtown Palmyra, New York. After translating the golden plates, Joseph Smith "agreed with Mr. Egbert B. Grandin to print five thousand copies" of the Book of Mormon. Publication of the book was financed by Martin Harris, a family friend who mortgaged part of his farm to guarantee the \$3,000 printing cost.

In mid-August 1829, the Prophet Joseph, with Martin Harris, Oliver Cowdery, Hyrum Smith, Joseph Smith Sr., and several others gathered around Grandin's press to print and inspect a proof sheet. Joseph declared the work was "excellent," and printing of the book began. The Book of Mormon was first offered for sale in Grandin's bookstore on March 26, 1830, as another witness of the divinity and mission of Jesus Christ. It also provides tangible evidence of the prophetic calling of Joseph Smith.

The Church purchased the Grandin Building in 1978 and opened it as a historic site several years later. At the conclusion of extensive restoration in 1998, the building was dedicated as the Book of Mormon Historic Publication Site.
