

Baptism is a Two-Way Promise

God promises:


Baptism is the "first fruits of repentance" Moroni 8:25

That I will be redeemed of God

That I will be part of the first resurrection

That I will receive eternal life

A covenant is an agreement between God and man but that God and man "do not act as equals in the agreement. God gives the conditions for the covenant, and men agree to do what he asks them to do. God then promises men certain blessings for their obedience" [Guide to the Scriptures, "Covenant"] That He will pour out His Spirit upon me



When we are baptized, we enter into a covenant with God.

Mosiah 18:8-10

8. And it came to pass that he said unto them: Behold, here are the waters of Mormon (for thus were they called) and now, as ye are desirous to come into the fold of God, and to be called his people, and are willing to bear one another's burdens, that they may be light;

9. Yea, and are willing to mourn with those that mourn; yea, and comfort those that stand in need of comfort, and to stand as witnesses of God at all times and in all things, and in all places that ye may be in, even until death, that ye may be redeemed of God, and be numbered with those of the first resurrection, that ye may have eternal life—

10. Now I say unto you, if this be the desire of your hearts, what have you against being baptized in the name of the Lord, as a witness before him that ye have entered into a covenant with him, that ye will serve him and keep his commandments, that he may pour out his Spirit more abundantly upon you?

Baptizing Helam

Alma was filled with the Holy Spirit

They were both buried in the water. Alma held the priesthood—one who was ordained after the holy order of God. Thus, he would have been baptized previously...

"...therefore, when Alma baptized himself with Helam that was not a case of Alma baptizing himself, but merely as a token to the Lord of his humility and full repentance." Joseph Fielding Smith "O Lord, pour out thy Spirit upon thy servant, that he may do this work with holiness of heart."



Alma and Helam were filled with the Holy Spirit

Did Alma Baptize Himself?



We may conclude that Alma held the priesthood before he, with others, became disturbed with King Noah. Whether this is so or not makes no difference because in the Book of Mosiah it is stated definitely that he had authority. If he had authority to baptize that is evidence that he had been baptized.

Therefore, when Alma baptized himself with Helam that was not a case of Alma baptizing himself, but merely as a token to the Lord of his humility and full repentance. Joseph Fielding Smith Jr.

Establishing The Church of God

They were called the Church of God or the Church of Christ from that time forward

Alma ordained priests—50 and taught them things concerning the kingdom of God






Teaching VS Preaching

Alma commands the priests to teach the things spoken of by the holy prophets and to preach repentance and faith in God





"The words preaching and teaching are sometimes used interchangeably. Like peanut butter and jelly, chips and salsa... you can have one without the other, but they often go together.

...good preaching always involves some teaching. On the other hand, good teaching does not always involve preaching." Pastor Mark Driscoll

Preaching—to the audience of believers and nonbelievers

Teaching—to the students or audience with the same focus

Unity of Faith

No contention among them



Looking forward with one eye—to be single minded, focused, and riveted on the cause of Christ.

Alma Commanded

The People:

To observe the Sabbath Day and Keep it Holy

To give thanks to the Lord



The priests:



They are to labor with their own hands for support

One day a week they are to set apart to gather together to teach the people and worship God

They were not to depend on the people for their support

They were to teach with the power and authority from God

According To Their Wants

To the People:

Of their substance—people should have what they need—the Law of Consecration—Law of Zion (D&C 105:3-5)

Impart of their own free will


The People:

"Working as a special agent for the FBI, my friend investigated organized crime groups transporting illegal drugs into the United States.


"On one occasion, he and another agent approached an apartment where they believed a known drug dealer was distributing cocaine. My friend describes what happened: "We knocked on the door of the drug dealer. The suspect opened the door, and upon seeing us, tried to block our view. But it was too late; we could see the cocaine on his table.

"'A man and a woman who were at the table immediately began removing the cocaine. We had to prevent them from destroying the evidence, so I quickly pushed the drug suspect who was blocking the door to the side. As I pushed him, my eyes met his. Strangely, he did not appear angry or afraid. He was smiling at me.

"'His eyes and disarming smile gave me the impression that he was harmless, so I quickly left him and started to move toward the table. The suspect was now behind me. At that instant, I had the distinct, powerful impression come into my mind: "Beware of the evil behind the smiling eyes."


"'I immediately turned back toward the suspect. His hand was in his large front pocket. Instinctively I grabbed his hand and pulled it from his pocket. Only then did I see, clutched in his hand, the semiautomatic pistol ready to fire. A flurry of activity followed, and I disarmed the man.' ...


Spiritual Warnings

The Lord sent Abinadi to warn the Nephites of the consequences of their sins.

The Lord sends Prophets to warn us against the evils of the day



Division Among the Remainder of the People

Those that were with Alma:

Were enjoying their peaceful life with their conversion



Choosing to follow unrighteous individuals can lead us to make poor decisions we will later regret



Those that stayed with King Noah:

Some began to breathe out threats against King Noah

There began to be contention among them



A strong military leader in the army of King Noah

He rose to take action against evil

Around 145 BC he led a revolt against the abuses of King Noah and attempted to slay him but was interrupted by the invasion of the Lamanites

King Noah's son, Limhi, later heeded Gideon's advice to disable their Lamanite guards with drunkenness and gained freedom for the people to return to Zarahemla

He became a teacher of the people in the Church of God

Around 91 BC he challenged arrogant zealot Nehor "with the words of God" (Alma 1:9)

Nehor slew Gideon with the sword

He gave his life in defending the truth





King Noah fled


Gideon pursued him to the tower by the temple






King Noah saw the Lamanite army were on the borders of the land

Gideon spared the king's life






He also fled before them

The Lamanites captured them and began to slay them

King Noah commanded that the women and children flee but many woman remained



Those who stayed had their fair daughters stand forth and plead with the Lamanites to not slay them

The Lamanites had compassion on them

They took them back to the Land of Nephi under the condition that they deliver up King Noah and their property—1/2 of what they had to pay tribute to the king of the Lamanites

Limhi

Son of King Noah

Grandson of Zeniff

He was appointed king by the voice of the people around 145 BC, but ascension to power began around 150 BC

He was the last of the Nephite kings in the colony established by Zeniff among the Lamanites in the land of Nephi

He did not seek after the wicked ways of his father, Noah

He served as a spiritual guide for his people

He sought to escape the bondage his people, where in with the Lamanites, and ruled in an atmosphere of constant fear of Lamanite attack and retribution



Who's Who

Limhi, the son of Noah, was also taken captive

He was desirous to not have his father destroyed

But he knew of his father's wickedness

Gideon sent men into the wilderness, secretly, to find the people and King Noah

They met the people in the wilderness, but King Noah and the priests were not there



The people had sworn that if they return to the Land of Nephi and if their wives and their children were slain, they would seek revenge, and perish with them

Earlier, King Noah commanded that they should not return, and they were angry with him, so they caused that he should suffer by fire

The priests fled into the wilderness






The people told Gideon that they had slain the king and the priests had fled further into the wilderness The men had told them what had happened to the people in the land of Nephi

And they rejoiced to hear that their loved ones were not slain

The King of the Lamanites made an oath to not slay them

The people made Limhi to be their king and he made an oath to the king of the Lamanites to pay tribute to him ½ of all they possessed Limhi began to establish peace among his people

The king of the Lamanites set guards around the people so they would not escape

For 2 years they had peace




In a place called Shemion, the daughters of the Lamanites danced and sang

The priests of King Noah who had fled further into the wilderness came upon the daughters

They took the daughters and went into the wilderness, there were 24 of them

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





When the Lamanites found out about their daughters, they were angry with Limhi...they thought it was his people who had carried the daughters away

The king and his people went into the land of Nephi to destroy the people of Limhi

Mosiah 20:6-7





Limhi discovered them while in the tower

He also discovered that they were preparing for war.

Alma gathered his people...

And departed to the fields and forest and laid wait

The Lamanites came upon them, and began to slay them for they fought like lions

The Lamanites thought their king was dead and they fled

The battle was "sore" and the people of Limhi fought for the wives and children like dragons and drove them back

The people brought the king of the Lamanites to Limhi and bound him

Mosiah 20:9-13

The king told Limhi he had broken the oath he had made because of the missing daughters

Limhi knew nothing of this and wanted to search for the priests Gideon, the king's captain, persuaded Limhi to not search for the priests of Noah

He reminded Limhi of Abinadi's prophecy

Gideon said it was better for them to be in bondage than to be slain

Limhi and his people went back to the Lamanites without weapons

The Lamanites had compassion on them and returned to their own land

Gideon Reminds Us of Abinadi's Words

Ignoring or rejecting the words of the Lord's servants brings suffering and sorrow

"We ... have our spiritual hurricane guardians, those whose calling it is to watch and warn, helping us avoid spiritual damage, destruction, and even death. Our watchmen on the tower are known to us as apostles and prophets. They are our spiritual eyes in the sky, and they know, through inspiration and insight and pure intelligence, the course these storms may take.





They continue to raise their voices in warning to tell us of the tragic consequences of willful and wanton violations of the Lord's commandments. To intentionally ignore their warnings is to court misery, sorrow, and ruin. To follow them is to follow the chosen servants of the Lord into spiritual pastures of peace and plenty."



A Prophecy Fulfilled--Bondage

Physical Captivity—Bondage

Surrounded--Guarded by Lamanites

Smite --to strike or hit hard, with or as if with the hand, a stick, or other weapon or to affect mentally, morally, or emotionally

Exercise Authority--the power or right to control, judge, or prohibit the actions of others

Afflictions—A condition of pain, suffering, or distress.





Spiritual Captivity

Guilt-- an emotion that occurs when a person believes that they have violated a moral standard that they themselves believe in.

Contentions—murmur against--complain

Pity themselves—sympathy and sorrow aroused by the misfortune or suffering

Impatience—Restless and unable to endure irritation or opposition; intolerant

Breech—Breaking the Oath



The People of Limhi broke the oath the King of the Lamanites and Limhi had made.

"And they did afflict the king sorely with their complaints; therefore he granted unto them that they should do according to their desires."— The pressure of the people





Their afflictions had come because they had rejected the Lord's invitation to repent

Why wasn't the Lord with them?

"As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten" Revelations 3:19

They were slow to hearken unto the voice of the Lord their God; therefore, the Lord their God is slow to hearken unto their prayers, to answer them in the day of their trouble. In the day of their peace they esteemed lightly my counsel; but, in the day of their trouble, of necessity they feel after me. D&C 101:7-8 "The Lord who is patient and long-suffering even with evil may be equally slow to redeem the transgressor. ...time and suffering are a part of the healing process." JFM and RLM

The Lord's Way--Deliverance

The Lord softened the Lamanites hearts so:

The people of Limhi burdens were lighter

The Lord did not see fit to deliver them out of bondage---yet



"... these trials [burdens] are not just to test us. They are vitally important to the process of putting on the divine nature. If we handle these afflictions properly, they will be consecrated for our gain." Paul V. Johnson



When we humble ourselves, call upon God, and repent of our sins, He will hear our prayers and ease the burden of our sins in His own time

The Test of Our Faith

"Enduring it well"

Part of the normal pattern of life on earth



"Mortality is a proving ground, a test of faith and obedience. By refining the submissive person, it makes him or her fit to return home to God." ...enduring well...is an essential part of mortality's planned refining process. Refining requires heat (trials). Refining also requires time. ...refining also requires...a genuine and continuing confidence in the Refiner (Jesus Christ)"



"We need perspective as to the length of our trials: perspective as regards their comparative intensity; assurance that, if we are faithful, our enemies will not finally prevail, either; and assurance that life's timetable for us is likewise know to God, "according as [our] works shall be."

The Lord allows us to experience trials to help us become humble and rely more upon Him <u>Some</u> trials and afflictions come as a result of disobedience


Our trials can give us opportunities to seek after and feel the Lord's power in our lives Mosiah 23:21






Prosper in the Land

By degrees—line upon line

The People:

Did not suffer from hunger



Kept watch over their people and their land

They were desirous to find the priest and punish them





The Priests who had taken the daughters of the Lamanites came into the land and taken grain and many precious things from the people of Limhi



There was no more disturbance between the Lamanites and the people of Limhi until the time that Ammon and his brethren came into the land.

Mosiah 21:16-22



Land of Desolation

Limhi sent a small number of men [43...Mosiah 8:7] to search for the Land of Zarahemla

The men were lost in the wilderness.

They found a land that had been covered with dry bones once peopled then destroyed

They found a record which Limhi could not read







Mosiah 21:25-28


People From the Land of Zarahemla

King Limhi discovers Ammon and others outside their walls

Thinking they are the priests...they are bound and cast into prison

Limhi discovers they are from the Land of Zarahemla and filled with "exceeding great joy"

Ammon tells Limhi that King Mosiah could interpret the engravings



Sorrow For Their Brethren

Ammon is filled with sorrow because:

So many had been slain by the Lamanites

That King Noah and the priest had led the people astray

That Abinadi had been martyred

That Alma and the people had left with some people and the people didn't know what happened to them







Faith Brings Freedom

"[Repentance] is essential to your happiness in this life and throughout eternity. Repentance is much more than just acknowledging wrongdoings. It is a change of mind and heart. ... It includes turning away from sin and turning to God for forgiveness. It is motivated by love for God and the sincere desire to obey His commandments" *True to the Faith*



King Limhi entered into a covenant with God and many of his people to serve and keep His commandments

No Authority: The people wanted to be baptized but Ammon "declined doing this thing"—feeling of unworthiness



They were desirous to escape as Alma had done and willing to serve God, but they must wait for their deliverance

Mosiah 21:32-36

Deliverance

The voice of the people—gathering together to discuss how to escape from the Lamanites

Gideon's idea:

Through the back pass, the back wall is where the Lamanites guard the people and are drunk at night

Gather the people and their flocks and herds and drive them into the wilderness

He will pay the last tribute to the Lamanites with wine and the Lamanites will be drunken and asleep

And they will travel around the land of Shilom










Land of Zarahemla



1. Mosiah I leads the few remaining righteous Nephites from the original land settled by Lehi to the Land of Zarahemla (Omni 1:3)

2. (About 200 BC ill fated expedition to return to Lehi-Nephi. Contention and infighting. All slain in the wilderness except 50 who return to Zarahemla (Omni 1:28) (Mosiah 9:1-3)

- 3. Zeniff leads a second expedition (abt. 200 BC) to Lehi-Nephi and settles there with the permission of King Laman (Mosiah 9: 3-10)
- 4. (about 148 BC) Alma flees King Noah to the Waters of Mormon (Mosiah 17 and 18)

5. (about 121 BC) King Limhi sends expedition of 43 men to find Zarahemla in hopes of escaping Lamanite bondage. They find remnants of Jaredites and 24 gold plates and return to Land of Lehi-Nephi (Mosiah 6: 7-8)

6. (About 121 BC) Ammon's expedition (16 "Strong Men") to find Zeniff's colony (Mosiah 7)

The Rights and Freedoms of Americans

In drafting the Constitution, most of the Founding Fathers believed that the safeguards written into it would protect the rights of Americans. But when the Constitution was sent to the states in 1787 for ratification, a great roar of disapproval went up. In Virginia, Patrick Henry protested vigorously against the lack of a specific statement of rights. Other Americans from different states demanded that a Bill of Rights be added to the Constitution. A number of states ratified the Constitution only conditionally. That is, they would approve the Constitution only if it were changed to include these rights.

Two years after the new American government went into effect, the *Bill of Rights* was added as the first ten amendments to the Constitution. Congress discussed nearly 200 proposals for amendments before it presented these ten to the states for approval. The states ratified these amendments, and they became part of the Constitution in 1791.

THE BILL OF RIGHTS

The first ten amendments to the Constitution, or the Bill of Rights, set forth the priceless rights or freedoms that all Americans may enjoy. A brief summary of these great freedoms is given here.

FREEDOM OF RELIGION

The first right, or freedom, guaranteed in the Bill of Rights is freedom of religion. This right is guaranteed in the First Amendment. *Freedom of* religion guarantees to all Americans the right to practice any religion they choose, or to practice no religion at all.

Congress is forbidden to establish any religion as our nation's official religion. Congress cannot favor any one religion over others or tax citizens in order to support any one religion.

FREEDOM OF SPEECH

The right to express your ideas and opinions when you speak is called freedom of speech. Freedom of speech also means the right to listen to the thoughts and opinions of others. This freedom guarantees that Americans are free to express their thoughts and ideas about anything. They may talk freely to their friends and neighbors or speak in public to a group of people. Of course, no one may use his freedom of speech to injure others. If a person knowingly says things that are false about another, he may be sued in court by the person or persons who believe they have been harmed by what he said.

Americans are free to express opinions about their government or anything else. They are free to criticize the actions of the government and of government officials. In a dictatorship, where the nation's government has all the powers, the people have no right to speak like this. They do not dare to criticize the actions of the government. If they do, they may be imprisoned. But all Americans enjoy the freedom of speech, which is guaranteed in the First Amendment.

FREEDOM OF THE PRESS

The freedom to express your ideas and opinions in writing is known as *freedom of* the *press*. This freedom is closely related to freedom of speech and is also guaranteed by the First Amendment.

Freedom of the press gives all Americans the right to express their ideas and thoughts freely in writing. This writing may be in newspapers, books, magazines, or any other printed or written form. Americans are also free to read what others write. They may read any newspaper, book or magazine they want. Because they are free to read a variety of facts and opinions, Americans can become better-informed citizens.

FREEDOM OF ASSEMBLY

Another priceless freedom guaranteed by the First Amendment is *freedom of assembly*, or freedom to hold meetings. Americans are free to meet together to discuss problems and to plan their actions. Of course, such meetings must be carried on in a peaceful way

FREEDOM OF PETITION

The *freedom of* petition is the right to ask your government to do something or to refrain from doing something. The First Amendment contains this guarantee, also. The freedom of petition gives you the right to write to your Congressman and request him to work for the passage of laws you favor. You are free to ask him to change laws that you do not like. The right of petition also helps government officials to know what Americans think and what actions they want the government to take.

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THE RIGHT TO BEAR ARMS

The Second Amendment to the Constitution guarantees Americans the *right* to bear *arms*. In the early years of our nation, Americans needed weapons in order to serve in the militia, or volunteer armies, that were established to defend our states. The militia provided protection during emergencies, too. Many Americans also believed that without weapons they would be powerless if the government tried to overstep its powers and rule by force.

"NO-QUARTERING" RIGHT

The Third Amendment states, "No soldier shall, in times of peace, be quartered in any house. . . ." Under British rule, the colonists sometimes had to feed and house British soldiers against their will. As a result, Americans wanted this practice forbidden under the Bill of Rights.

THE RIGHT TO EQUAL JUSTICE

The Bill of Rights contains many rights that are guaranteed to persons accused of a crime. Amendments Five, Six, Seven, and Eight are all concerned with these rights. Our nation places great importance on these rights in order to guarantee equal justice for all Americans.

A person must be indicted, or formally accused of a crime, by a group of citizens called a "grand jury" before he can be brought into court for trial.

A person accused of a crime is guaranteed the right to know what law he is accused of breaking.

A person accused of a crime has a right to a prompt public trial by a jury of his fellow citizens.

An accused person cannot be put into prison and kept there for weeks or months while awaiting a trial. He has the right to leave jail, in most cases, if he can raise a certain sum of money, or bail, as a pledge that he will appear at his trial.

An accused person has a right to a lawyer to represent him in court.

All the testimony and evidence against an accused person must be presented publicly in court.

The accused person has the right to call any witnesses to appear if their testimony will help him.

The accused person cannot be forced to testify or give evidence against himself.

If the accused person is found guilty, he cannot be given cruel or unusual punishment. If the accused person is found not guilty of a serious crime, he cannot be tried a second time for this same crime.

THE RIGHT TO OWN PRIVATE PROPERTY

The Fifth Amendment guarantees Americans the right to own private property. No person may take away anything that we own. Nor can the government seize our land, money, or other forms of property without cause, or without paying for it. The right to own private property is one of America's basic freedoms. Our free economic system is based upon this right.

THE RIGHT TO ENJOY MANY OTHER FREEDOMS

To make doubly sure that Americans should enjoy every right and freedom possible, Amendment Nine was added to the Constitution. This amendment states that the list of rights contained in the Bill of Rights is not complete. There are many other rights that all Americans have and will continue to have even though they are not mentioned in the Bill of Rights. Among them are the following.

Freedom to live or travel anywhere in our nation

Freedom to work at any job for which we can qualify

Freedom to marry and raise a family

Freedom to receive a free education in good public schools

Freedom to join a political party, a union, and other legal groups

As a final guarantee of our rights, the Tenth Amendment set aside many powers of government for the states. This Amendment says that all powers not given to the federal government by the Constitution, nor forbidden to the states, are set aside for the states, or for the people. This provision leaves with the states the power to act in many ways to guarantee the rights of their citizens.

SUMMARY

Government is the authority or power that people establish to help them run their affairs.

Governments serve many important purposes, but the most important one is that government makes it possible for people to live and work together. Government provides us with rules of conduct we can follow. Government makes it possible for people to live by known laws, and helps provide many services that citizens acting alone could not perform themselves. Our nation's government is based on the American Constitution. This Constitution, together with its Bill of Rights and other amendments, provides us with a workable plan of government. The Constitution also guarantees to all Americans many priceless rights and freedoms.

Our nation's government is based upon the approval, or consent, of the people who are governed. It is a federal system in which certain powers are given to the national government and other powers are left to the states and to the people. Certain powers are shared by both federal and state governments. In both federal and state governments, powers are separated and balanced among three branches of government.
