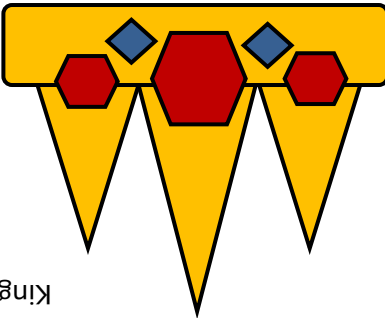

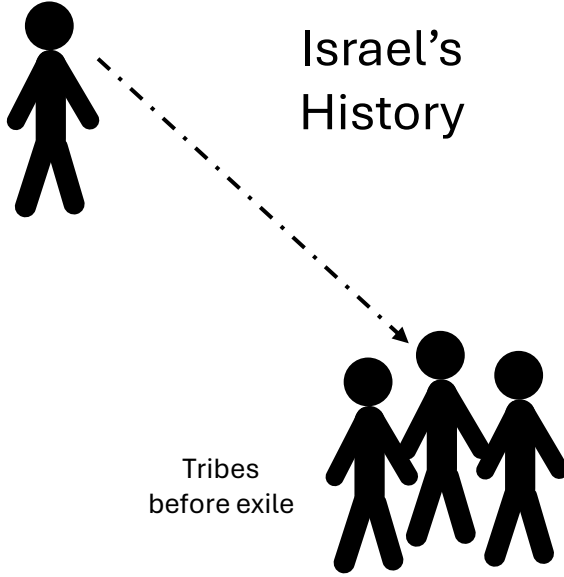

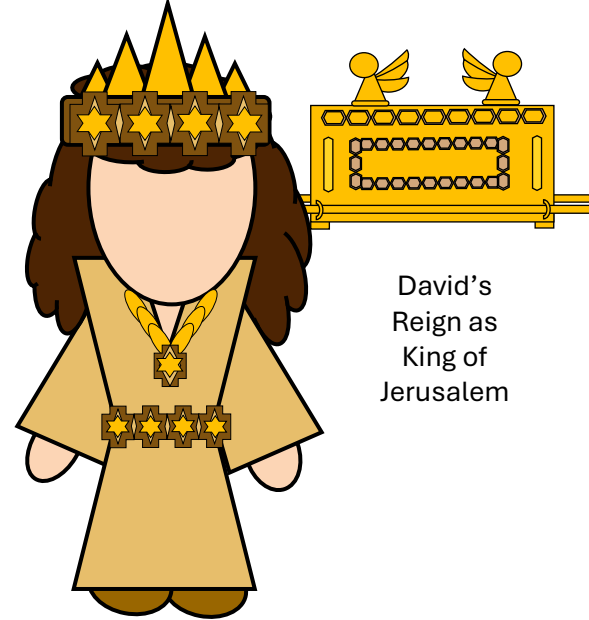

1 and 2 Chronicles

Genealogies (Ch. 1-9): Traces Israel's history from Adam through the tribes to the post-exilic community.

Death of Saul (Ch. 10): Saul's death due to unfaithfulness, establishing the transition to David.

David's Reign (Ch. 11-29):

- David becomes king and captures Jerusalem (Ch. 11).
- The Ark of the Covenant is brought to Jerusalem to a new tent.
- God's covenant promise to David (Ch. 17).
- David's military victories and census.
- Extensive preparations for the Temple, including organizing priests, Levites, and musicians.

Key Events in 2 Chronicles

Solomon's Reign (Ch. 1-9):

- Solomon receives wisdom at Gibeon.
- Construction and dedication of the Temple in Jerusalem.
- God's glory fills the Temple.

Division of the Kingdom (Ch. 10): Rebellion against Rehoboam, splitting the kingdom.

History of Judah's Kings (Ch. 11-36):

- Focus on Judah's kings, particularly reformers like Asa, Jehoshaphat, Joash, Hezekiah, and Josiah.
- Hezekiah's restoration of the Passover (Ch. 30).
- Josiah's reforms and finding the Law (Ch. 34-35).

Exile and Restoration (Ch. 36):

- Destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple by Babylon.
- The decree of Cyrus the Great (Persia) allows the Jews to return and rebuild the Temple, ending the exile.
