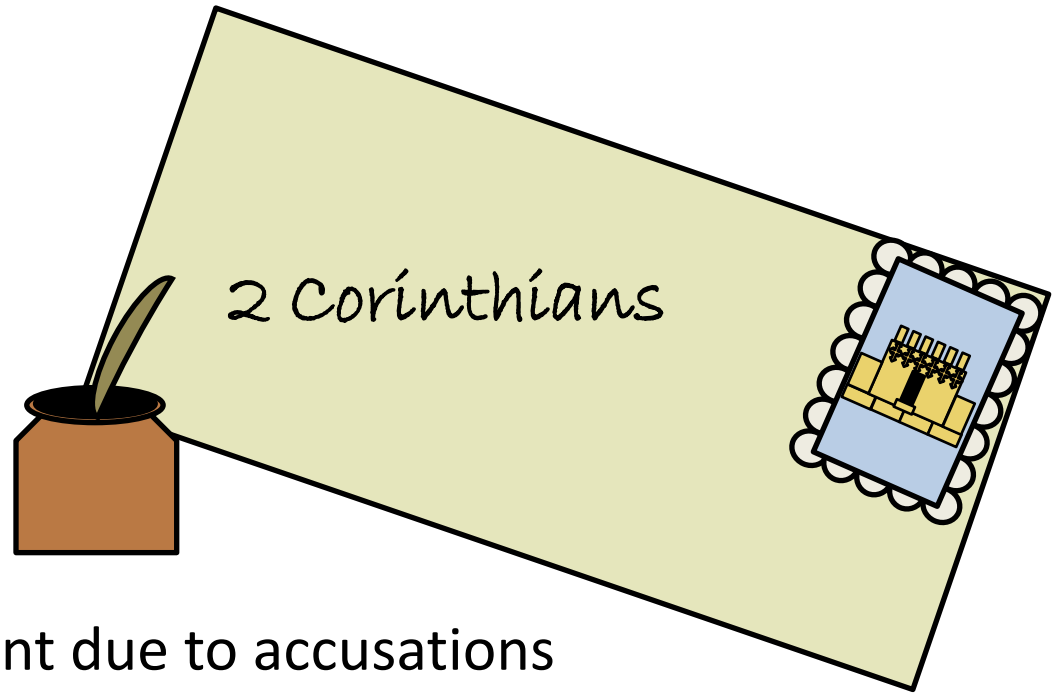
2 Corinthians



Paul is the author of 2 Corinthians

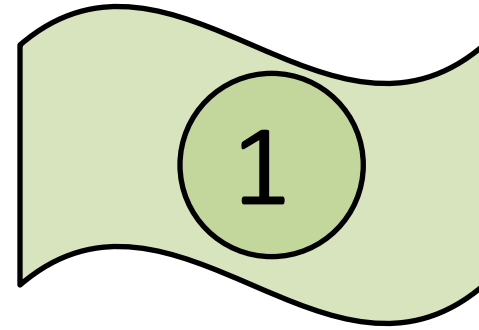
2nd Corinthians is a follow-up letter. It is to the same Church members and also to the Saints living in Achaia a Roman province comprising all of Greece.

2 Corinthians



*A growing discontent due to accusations of false teachers. Paul writes to answer these accusations and reassures the Saints in their faith.

Historical Background:



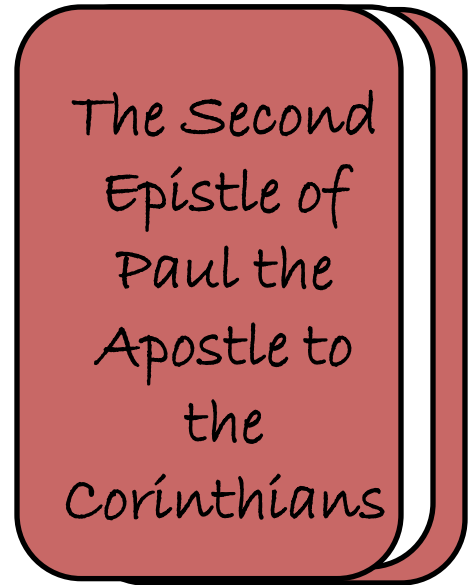
*A riot developed in Ephesus in opposition to Paul's teaching while he waited for word of a close friend Titus who visited Corinth after the 1st letters.

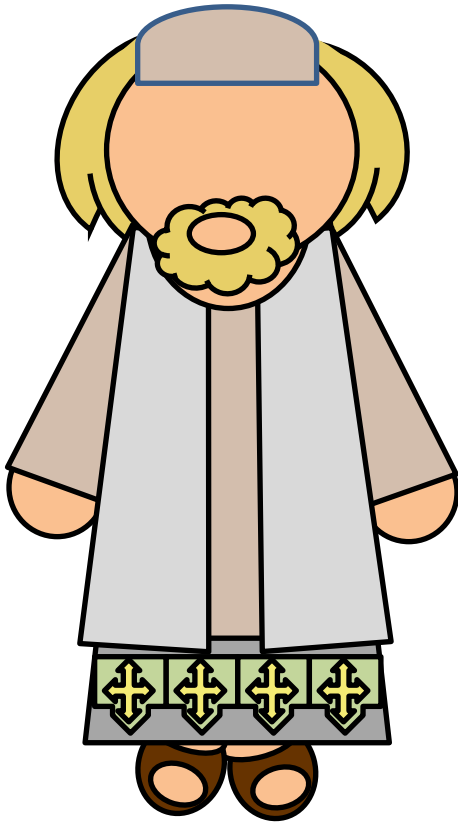
*Paul fled to Macedonia, and Titus joined him while he heard news from Corinth

*Teachers from Corinth had accused Paul of taking money that was collected for the poor in Jerusalem. They also challenged Paul's authority as an Apostle.

In The Second Epistle of Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians:

- *The body is a temple for the Holy Spirit.
- *Gives instructions regarding missionaries and marriage
- *Explains the gifts of the Spirit
- *Virtues of Charity
- *Encouragement to the Corinthian Saints to be unified.





Testimony of Paul to 2 Corinthians:

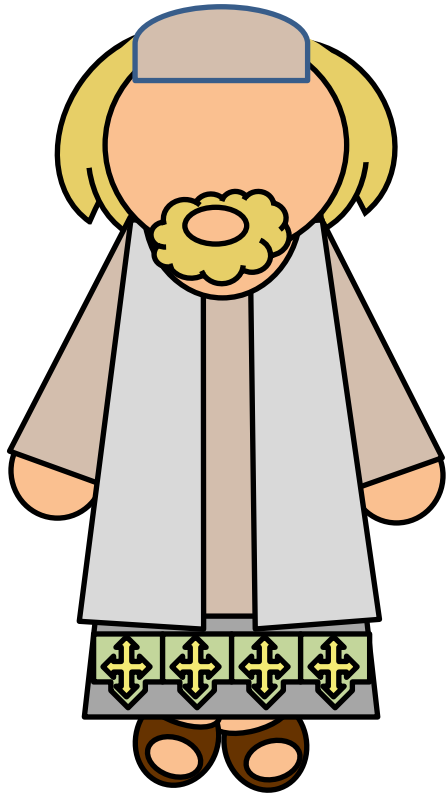

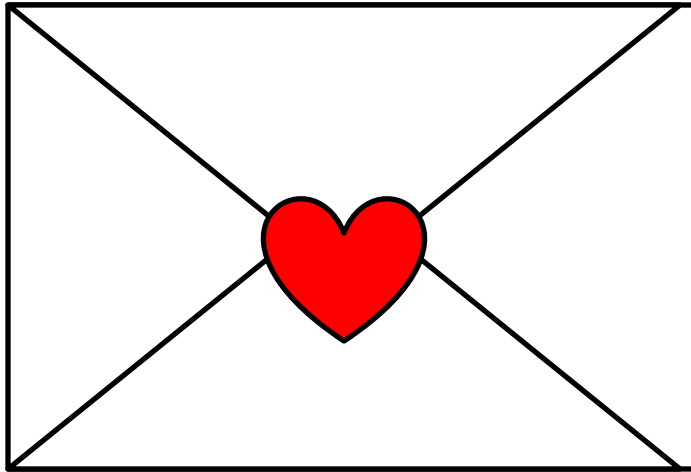
2 Corinthians 2: 1-11

- The Saints are sealed and given assurance by the Spirit in their hearts



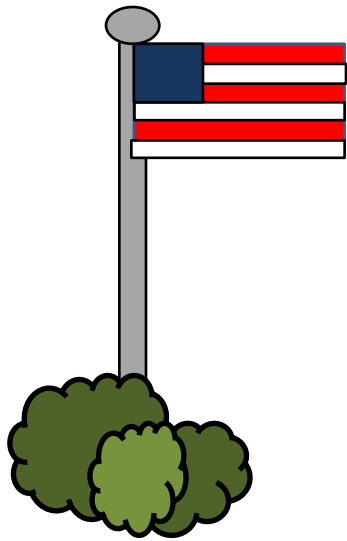
2 Corínthians 2
